<p>Ms. Wilson has served as a laboratory supervisor for CRA's Lexington, KY office since 1997. Before this, she was an Assistant laboratory director, laboratory technician, and field technician for Wilbur Smith Associates, Lexington, Kentucky. Ms. Wilson oversees the processing of archeological materials brought in from the field from small projects and large projects. Several large projects in her charge were the processing of 43,000 artifacts from phase III excavations at McConnell Station, 50,000 artifacts recovered from Higbee Tavern, over 95,000 artifacts from 13 sites excavated for the Argosy Casino project in Indiana, and over 172,000 artifacts from the community of Monterey. Her duties include all aspects of artifact processing, analysis and cataloging and daily maintenance of site records. Ms. Wilson also directs the process of preparing collections for curation. Ms. Wilson has prepared collections for curation at the Pratt Museum at the Fort Campbell Military Installation, the William S. Webb Museum of Anthropology at the University of Kentucky, University of Louisville, Ball State University in Muncie, Indiana, Illinois State Museum, Ohio Historical Society, Missouri Department of Transportation, and the Tennessee Division of Archeology.</p> <p>Ms. Wilson has worked on a number and variety of projects. In addition to laboratory work, she has field experience on survey, testing, and mitigation or major excavation projects, working on a variety of prehistoric and historic sites. She also has experience in the analysis of bioarcheological remains. Ms. Wilson attended field school through the University of Kentucky. They investigated archeological deposits at Shakertown at Pleasant Hill (historic) and the Croley-Evans Site (15Kx24) (prehistoric).
